

LIT for March will feature a conversation on unity and the body of Christ. What exactly do we mean when we talk about our desire for unity within our congregation and with the broader church? Phil Kniss, lead pastor of Parkview Mennonite Church, will identify four different kinds of church unity: kingdom unity, missional unity, functional unity, and covenantal unity. We will use Phil's paradigm, which has sparked vibrant and hopeful conversations within Virginia Mennonite Conference in recent months, as a framework for discussing how we can relate with different degrees of unity within and beyond our congregation.
