Its goal is to form connections and strengthen the fabric of understanding, acceptance and integration across our community. Linking Communities allows individual families or small groups who might not have the resources to provide a full-refugee sponsorship, the opportunity to none-theless reach out to newly arrived refugees in friendship and support at whatever level Local individuals/groups they can. interested in partnering with a refugee family go through a 3 hour training. The training covers, program expectations, background about refugee resettlement, refugees sharing their experiences, L.C. families talking about joys and challenges, and scenarios for discussion. People interested in learning more are welcome to come to the training and then decide if they would like to sign up for Linking Communities Program.
