
FiA Announces Affordable Housing Campaign “Asks”

Last fall, Faith in Action, an ecumenical community organizing group of which CMC is a member, announced that their next campaign is aimed at making housing more affordable for working people in Harrisonburg. After gathering information from numerous stakeholders, FiA has decided to make the following asks of our community leaders:

1. The City of Harrisonburg and Rockingham County jointly fund and administer an Affordable Housing Trust Fund. The purpose of this Fund would be to encourage the preservation of existing affordable housing and creation of new affordable housing for households at 80% of area median income and below.
2. An appropriation of at least \$750,000 annually each from City and County to fund the Affordable Housing Trust Fund.
3. A Housing Advisory Committee be established comprised of both City and County staff as well as several community members from the population served, builders, realtors, service providers, and other members at-large, ensuring racial and economic equity to advise on both the inflow and outflow of Affordable Housing Trust funds.

The Hate U Give Kicks Off Anti-Oppression Film Series

The Hate U Give will be the first of several movies sponsored by the Anti-oppression Task Force to be shown at Community Mennonite. It presents the powerful story of a young black woman, Starr, who lives with her family in a black community but attends a more exclusive school in a white neighborhood.

Starr finds herself caught between two worlds, not sure sometimes in which she belongs, but after witnessing the shooting of her life-long friend, clarity slowly emerges and she understands

herself, and her power, in new ways.

The CMC Anti-oppression Task Force is launching a film & discussion series over the next several months to help people look more deeply at racism, privilege, racialized structures, etc. Plan to see the film and engage in the discussion following.

The movie is just over two hours in length and is rated PG-13.

On the Brink of Everything: Grace, Gravity, & Growing Old


